By Car

Innsbruck / Stubai is located on major traffic routes with well-developed road networks, which makes the region easily accessible by car.

From Vienna: A12 motorway.

<u>From Switzerland:</u> A12 motorway. Through the Arlberg Road Tunnel or toll-free via the Arlberg region.

From Italy: A22/A13 (Brenner motorway); tolls apply from the exit Innsbruck-Süd.

From Munich: A12 motorway

ACCOMMODATION | CATERING UPDATE

Participating teams will be allocated to selected hotels to both host region venues Innsbruck and Stubai. The teams will stay together in the same hotel (as possible).

Please indicate the length of your stay and the arrival date as well as the number of participants in the Preliminary Entry Form, which will be sent out together with this General Information Sheet, so we can book the hotels accordingly. If this number changes significantly, please send us an email.

The LOC is covering the costs for 4 nights for participating quota athletes and team officials during the event. For all quota athletes running two races, a 5th night is covered by the LOC. Regarding all non-quota athletes and additional officials, the federation will be charged 100€ per person per night for accommodation and the full board of 4 nights.

Teams planning to arrive before June 06, 2023 or for training purposes during the year please contact the tourism boards at incoming@innsbruck.info (Innsbruck) or stubaitouristik@stubai.at (Stubai-Valley).

Catering for athletes will be provided in both venues. Breakfast will take place in each hotel. Lunch and dinner will be served in the Catering area of both venues. Please indicate food restrictions of the athletes within the final entry form.






TRANSPORTATION

The sophisticated transportation concept includes a permanent transport service between the two venues Neustift and Innsbruck. At expected peak times (e.g., before the competitions), separate shuttles for athletes will be set up to guarantee an uncomplicated and easy arrival to the races. We kindly ask all teams to make use of our transport concept not only for ecological reasons but to avoid congestions, too. Both Venues offer several facilities (showers, dedicated rest areas, team catering, etc.) to reduce the usage of permanent shuttles to the needs of the athletes only.





MEDIA OPERATIONS UPDATE

During the WMTRC 2023, a dedicated staff of professionals, freelancers and volunteers will support the work of journalists, photographers, social media content creators, bloggers, video-professionals and so on.

They will work in the Media rooms in Innsbruck and Stubai, they also will have designated areas after the finish lines for interviewing the athletes or along the course for taking pictures or videos. Please note that all athletes must leave the Field of Play through the Mixed Zone. However, they are not obliged to talk to the media if they don't want to.

Press Conferences will be organized according to the needs of International Federations and of the Local Organizing Committee. If a Press Conference of medal winners will be organized, the three individual medal winning athletes and (if necessary) one athlete per team of the three medal winning nations are expected to participate.

All Media facilities will also be accessible for media representatives of the international and national federations. If you want to accredit your own media people (e.g., communications manager, photographer, social media manager), please note that accreditations for this client group will open separately, probably in the second half of February. Opening for media accreditation will be posted on our website and will be communicated through different channels.

NEW! LIVE EVENT PRODUCTION

In order to offer on-site spectators, the best possible experience, we pay a lot of attention to our live event production. As we aim to offer live streams of every competition (that you will hopefully share via your channels) and, in addition, aim to be featured on free TV, the main focus of our live event production is on TV production and distribution. We are planning on working with up to 20 camera runners to capture every step of the top 3 runners of every race, and we are already looking forward to those impressions being distributed and broadcast – on air or digitally – all over the world.

INSURANCE AND INDEMNITIES

Participating Member Federations are responsible for taking out their own insurance to cover the risk of illness or injury of any member of their team when travelling to and from 2023 World Mountain and Trail Running Championships Innsbruck–Stubai and during the event itself. Please take the necessary steps to fulfil these requirements well in advance.

Except in relation to gross negligence or wilful misconduct of the organiser (LOC), the Participating Member Federations defends and holds harmless the organiser from and against any personal injury or material damages, losses and claims arising out of the participation at the Championships.
